

Patent Annuities: Indonesia

As a useful resource to empower offices and teams that wish to centralise their <u>IP renewals</u>, in this monthly series of articles, we explain the nuances of different country rules for patent renewal payments.





In Indonesia, annuity fees are due after the patent has granted. Accumulated fees from the filing of the application must be paid within 6 months of the grant date, as well as the renewal for that year. Each subsequent payment of the annual fees should be made in the relevant subsequent year no later than one month before the anniversary of the filing date.

Renewals are calculated in 2-steps

- We calculate the date the renewal is due.
- We calculate and display what the renewal year will be.

In order for IPRIS to accurately calculate Indonesia renewals the application number, application date, registration number, registration date and number of claims are required.

Fact

Annuities are due annually one month before the anniversary of the filing date.

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


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International Applications via WIPO Administered Treaties

From 2016 to 2020 there has been a drastic increase in international applications filed using the Madrid system compared to applications via the PCT system in Indonesia. PCT filing rates have been steady from 106 to 2019 and have then jumped up in 2020. However, international applications have more than doubled from 2018 to 2020 for trademarks in the country

Worked example

If a patent application has the filing date of 01/01/2017, and the grant date was 17/09/2020, the 6th year renewal fee would be due on 01/12/2021.

If the renewal is not paid prior to its respective due date, the patent will be declared null and void. However, it is still possible to pay annual fees within a grace period of 12 months by filing a written request for extension of the time limit and paying the prescribed surcharge fee for late payment. This request must be submitted not later than seven days before the expiration of the time limit for paying the fees.

Each country rule is live and in-built within the IPRIS web solutions (including grace period) for our clients' to view their patent and trademark portfolio and instruct through their secure online portal account at any time during this term.

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
